

Admission to Adelaide University through the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Access Pathway is only available to people of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent.

To apply for this pathway, or for other First Nations specific services and supports, applicants need to provide confirmation of their descent. These include:

- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Access Pathway
- First Nations Tutorial
- Peer Mentoring Program
- First Nations Student Support
- Accommodation and Housing Services
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Scholarships

Applicants need to provide either:

- a copy of their Confirmation of Aboriginality, or
- the completed 'Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Descent Declaration' form (attached).

Definition

An Australian Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander is someone who:

- is of Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander descent
- identifies as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander; and
- is accepted as such by the community in which he or she lives or has lived.

The declaration requires applicants to confirm all three of these points:

- that they are of Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander descent (with some, or all ancestors being Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander)
- that they identify as Aboriginal and/or Torres Strait Islander
- that they are recognised by their community as such

Important

The DVC Indigenous Office, Outreach and Engagement cannot confirm or verify an individual's Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander heritage.

Section 136 of the Criminal Code Act 1995 makes it an offence punishable by imprisonment for 12 months for a person to make a statement to a Commonwealth entity in a document knowing that statement to be false or misleading.
