

Adelaide Law Review Submission Guide

The *Adelaide Law Review* is a refereed journal. Submissions will be reviewed by the Editorial Board, before being sent for double-blind peer review prior to acceptance. Submissions are accepted on a rolling basis and may be sent at any time of year.

Submissions may address any area of Australian law. Where a paper addresses foreign, comparative or international law, we will only consider it for publication if we think that it will be of interest to an Australian audience. Accordingly, we do not publish works purely on the law of individual foreign jurisdictions. We are interested in comparative works, but Australia should usually be one of the jurisdictions examined, or the paper should clearly articulate its relevance to Australian law. Works on international law should address topics that have some relevance to Australia.

The *Adelaide Law Review* prefers to publish articles of fewer than 12,000 words (including footnotes), although we are willing to consider longer submissions where the topic warrants it. We also welcome comments (suggested length 2,000-3,000 words), which are reviewed by the Comments Editor (but may not be peer reviewed). Please note that we do not accept submissions of case notes other than from our Student Editors, and we do not accept book review submissions.

Manuscript Requirements

In preparing manuscripts for submission, authors should be guided by the following points:

1. Submissions should be made by email to alr@adelaide.edu.au
2. Authors are expected to check the accuracy of all references in their manuscript before submission. It is not always possible to submit proofs for correction.
3. Biographical details should be starred (*) and precede the footnotes. They should include the author's current employment.
4. Submissions should comply with the *Australian Guide to Legal Citation* (Melbourne University Law Review Association, 4th ed, 2018).
5. An abstract of between 150 and 200 words should also be included with all submissions.
6. As a peer-reviewed journal, the *Adelaide Law Review* requires exclusive submission. Submissions should be accompanied by a statement that the submission is not currently under consideration at any other journal, and that the author undertakes not to submit it for consideration elsewhere until the *Adelaide Law Review* has either accepted or rejected it.
7. If the submission is accepted by the *Adelaide Law Review*, it will be published electronically only.
8. Authors must sign an Author Agreement prior to the publication of their submission.
