BIOGRAPHY

Maurice Edward Doley was born in South Australia in 1907. He studied architecture and graduated from the South Australian School of Mines and Industries with an Architectural Draftsman's Certificate in 1930 before being articled to William Lucas until the Depression. After further study he graduated in 1939 with a Fellowship of the South Australian School of Mines and Industries and University of Adelaide Diploma in Applied Science in the course of Architectural Engineering and worked at the Architects-In-Chief Department between c.1937 and 1940.

After World War Two, Doley joined George Gavin Lawson and Jack Cheesman to form 'Lawson Cheesman and Doley, becoming one of the directors of the architectural practice which became Cheesman Doley Neighbour & Raffin Pty. Ltd., and which was known both locally and nationally. Doley's 'great love of nature was at the core of his architectural work' (Platten 1993). He undertook residential, commercial, industrial, civic and institutional work. He used materials such as straw, timber and stone. Doley is best known for his own residence located at Marryatville and the Nunyara chapel at Belair, both of which expressed his interest in nature.

In 1933 Doley became an Associate of the South Australian Institute of Architects. He served on many committees of the South Australian Chapter of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects. From 1964-6 Doley was elected and served as the President of the South Australian Chapter of the Royal Australian Institute of Architects. He died on 2 December 1992.
