

| SCHOLARSHIP TERMS AND CONDITIONS | |
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| Scholarship | Adelaide Launch Your Future ASEAN Scholarship |
| Scholarship Inclusions and Value of Fee Waiver and Grant | <p>Subject to the terms and conditions set out in this document, the Scholarship includes:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • reduction of 50% of the International Student tuition fee for each applicable Study Period (Fee Waiver); and • a grant of AU \$10,000 paid in two equal instalments as per below (Grant). |
| Grant Payment | <p>Subject to the Grant Eligibility Criteria set out below, the Grant will be paid to the Scholarship recipient in two equal instalments of AU \$5,000, with the first instalment payable no more than 30 days after the Census Date of the first Study Period in which the recipient is enrolled, and the second instalment payable no more than 30 days after the Census Date of the second Study Period in which the recipient is enrolled.</p> |
| Fee Waiver Duration | <p>For the minimum standard full-time duration of the recipient's undergraduate or postgraduate Coursework Program at Adelaide University, as specified on the Offer of Admission and accepted by the recipient.</p> |
| Scholarship Eligibility Criteria | <p>To be eligible for the Scholarship, an applicant must:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. be an International Student and be a citizen of one of the following countries: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cambodia • Indonesia • Malaysia • Philippines • Singapore • Thailand • Vietnam • Myanmar • Laos • Timor-Leste • Brunei 2. be applying for admission to a CRICOS registered Bachelor Degree of at least 96 units (after the application of any Credit/RPL) or a CRICOS registered Masters Degree of at least 72 units (after the application of any credit/RPL) at Adelaide University; 3. satisfy one of the following in the qualification used as the basis of admission to the Adelaide University degree: |

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| | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Undergraduate only: applicants with a minimum Australian Tertiary Admission Rank (ATAR) of 99 (or international equivalent); and • Undergraduate and postgraduate: applicants with a minimum overall Grade Point Average (GPA) of 6.7 (on a 7.0 scale) or comparable score; <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. not be applying for admission to an Excluded Program; 5. not be an Australia Awards recipient; and 6. not be an International Sponsored Student entitled to an International Sponsored Student tuition fee waiver that is equal to or greater than the Value of the Fee Waiver under the Scholarship (in which case the International Sponsored Student fee waiver will apply and not the Scholarship Fee Waiver, or the Grant). Note: a student cannot receive both a Scholarship Fee Waiver and an International Sponsored Student tuition fee waiver concurrently. <p>To be considered for a Scholarship, applicants must submit a separate application form by the relevant closing date (as published on the website). Eligible applications will be considered by a selection panel and successful recipients notified of the outcome prior to their commencement at Adelaide University.</p> |
| Grant Eligibility Criteria | <p>To receive the Grant payments, at each Census Date where a Grant instalment is payable, the Scholarship recipient must:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • continue to meet the Scholarship Eligibility Criteria; • be enrolled on a full-time basis in the Program for which the Scholarship was awarded; and • have an Australian bank account, the details of which have been provided to Adelaide University. |
| Fee Waiver Terms and Conditions | <p>The ongoing award of the Fee Waiver is subject to the following terms and conditions:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. The recipient must remain an International Student for the duration of the Fee Waiver. 2. The recipient must maintain a full-time study load or a study load in accordance with an approved Study Plan for each Study Period for the duration of the Fee Waiver. 3. The recipient must maintain a minimum Program Term GPA of at least 5.5 on a 7.0 scale (Minimum GPA) in reviews of academic progress carried out each compulsory Study Period. The Fee Waiver may be suspended if the recipient's GPA falls below the Minimum GPA. If a recipient's overall GPA falls below the Minimum GPA, the Fee Waiver will not be applied to the next invoice. If a recipient's GPA returns to the Minimum GPA or above, the Fee Waiver will recommence and will be applied to the next invoice. |

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4. The recipient cannot transfer the Fee Waiver to another Program, unless otherwise determined by Adelaide University at its absolute discretion. For the avoidance of doubt, changing the Major/Specialisation within a Program provided the CRICOS Code remains the same will not impact the Fee Waiver.
5. Adelaide University will apply the Fee Waiver directly to the tuition fee account of the recipient. The Fee Waiver will reduce the recipient's tuition fee liability by the Value of the Fee Waiver for each Study Period in the Fee Waiver Duration. The Fee Waiver may not be reflected on the recipient's tuition fee account until the Census Date of the Study Period in which they commence their Program.
6. The recipient will have full responsibility for:
 - a. the residual balance of the tuition fees payable for the Program; and
 - b. all other fees and expenses associated with the recipient's participation in the Program, including the costs of visas, Overseas Student Health Cover (OSHC), travel, accommodation, living expenses, textbooks, study materials or any other expenses associated with living in Adelaide or study at Adelaide University.
7. The Fee Waiver does not cover, and the recipient will be liable for, any additional tuition fees payable by the recipient for:
 - a. any Courses within the Program for which the recipient has received Credit; and
 - b. any Courses enrolled in another institution, including Cross-Institutional Study.
8. The Fee Waiver is not transferable to a third party or redeemable for cash.
9. The Fee Waiver cannot be deferred to a different commencing intake.
10. If a Leave of Absence is approved by Adelaide University for exceptional circumstances, the recipient will retain their Fee Waiver provided the Leave of Absence is not greater than one year.
11. If an applicant receives more than one Offer of Admission with a Fee Waiver for the Program, the latest Offer of Admission with a Fee Waiver will supersede any previous Offer issued to the applicant.
12. Adelaide University will award the highest value Fee Waiver the applicant is eligible for at the time of application. Applicants are only eligible to receive one fee waiver applied as a tuition fee waiver in their Offer of Admission (i.e. a student cannot receive multiple fee waivers concurrently).

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| | <p>13. The offer of Fee Waiver will be withdrawn by Adelaide University if the recipient's Offer of Admission is withdrawn for any reason. The recipient will be liable for the full tuition fees if the Fee Waiver is withdrawn.</p> <p>14. The Fee Waiver may be terminated if the recipient:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> does not comply with the rules, codes, policies and procedures applicable to Students of Adelaide University; does anything that damages or is likely to damage the reputation of Adelaide University, including engaging in disparaging comments regarding Adelaide University or its Program; fails to pay their tuition fees within the payment deadlines stipulated by Adelaide University; has supplied incorrect or misleading information in or in relation to their application for admission to the Program or Fee Waiver; is excluded, terminated or withdraws from enrolment in the Program prior to completing the requisite Courses; takes a Leave of Absence greater than one year; or is, in the reasonable opinion of Adelaide University, not complying with the terms and conditions set out in this document. <p>15. The recipient must notify the area responsible for Fee Waiver administration immediately if they:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> intend to transfer to another Program within Adelaide University; intend to discontinue full-time study in the Program; intend to transfer to another institution; cease to be an International Student; intend to seek a retrospective withdrawal from any requisite courses they have enrolled in; or intend to defer their studies and/or apply for Leave of Absence. |
| Other Scholarship Terms and Conditions | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> Adelaide University reserves the right to make changes to this document, and the terms and conditions of the Scholarship, without notice. In the event of any such change, all current recipients of a Scholarship or offer of a Scholarship will continue to have the terms and conditions in this document as applicable at the time the Scholarship was awarded honoured. The recipient is encouraged to seek independent advice on any tax implications of the Scholarship. |

International Sponsored Students (excluding Australia Awards applicants) are eligible for all International Student commencing student Scholarships.</p> <p>4. Applicants accepting an Offer of Admission with a Scholarship are accepting the terms and conditions set out in this document.</p> |
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| Definitions | In this document unless expressed or implied to the contrary: |
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| Award | means the qualification conferred upon a student following the successful completion of an academic Program. The categories of award include: Associate Degree, Diploma, Bachelor Degree, Honours Degree, Degree with Honours, Graduate Certificate, Graduate Diploma, Master Degree (both coursework and research), Doctoral Degree (both coursework and research) and Higher Doctorate; |
| Bachelor Degree | means an undergraduate award of three or more years of full-time or equivalent part-time study; |
| Census Date | means the date within each Study Period (or research period for research degree programs) by which a student's enrolment must be finalised for a course, and applicable fees and charges are incurred. It is the last day that a student can withdraw from a course and have it deleted from their academic record. It is also the deadline for various financial requirements, including submission of request for Commonwealth support and HECS-HELP form; submission of request for FEE-HELP Assistance; payment of any up-front payment of student contribution; obtaining a HECS-HELP loan; or supplying a Tax File Number; |
| Course | means the basic component of an academic Program and is sometimes referred to as a subject. Each course is assigned a unit value, generally 6 units per course, reflecting the proportion of academic progress within the total unit requirements of the Program; |
| Coursework Program | means a mode of study constituted of courses involving directed learning as either face-to-face learning, online learning, or a combination of these; |
| Credit | means the value assigned for the recognition of achievement of prior learning. Credit reduces the volume of new learning required to achieve a university qualification; |
| Cross-Institutional Study | is where a student undertaking a Program at an institution is permitted to enrol in individual Courses at another institution and count these towards their Program; |
| Degree | means a degree is any of a wide range of university Programs, including Bachelor, Masters, and PhD Awards; |
| Excluded Programs | are the following Programs: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Bachelor of Dental Surgery 2. Bachelor of Medical Radiation Science (Honours) (including all majors) 3. Bachelor of Medical Studies |

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| | <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 4. Bachelor of Midwifery 5. Bachelor of Occupational Therapy (Honours) 6. Bachelor of Physiotherapy (Honours) 7. Bachelor of Podiatry (Honours) 8. Bachelor of Science (Veterinary Bioscience) 9. Bachelor of Speech Pathology (Honours) 10. Doctor of Clinical Dentistry 11. | International Sponsored Student | means a student whose studies are funded, in full or in part, by a sponsoring body, for instance a government organisation, an employer, or another educational institution. The sponsoring body may cover tuition fees and/or living expenses and other non-tuition fees; |
| International Student | means a person studying in Australia who is not an Australian citizen, Australian permanent resident, New Zealand citizen, or holder of an Australian permanent resident humanitarian visa; |
| Leave of Absence | means a time period during which Adelaide University permits a student to remain unenrolled from courses but retain their place in a program; |
| Major | means a sequence of courses in a study area at the undergraduate level. Majors consist of 8 courses or 48 units at the undergraduate level; |
| Masters Degree | means a postgraduate Degree that may be undertaken by either research or coursework; |
| Non-Award Program | means a program of study that does not lead to an Award; |
| Offer of Admission | means a letter issued to a successful international applicant detailing the Program, and, if applicable, the Major or Specialisation for which they are being offered admission; |
| Program | means an approved combination of courses to obtain a degree, certificate or diploma. This can include Non-Award Programs or enabling programs; |
| Program Term GPA | means the Grade Point Average (GPA) calculated for a specific Study Period per Program. It includes all Courses completed per Program during that time and reflects your academic performance for that period only. |

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| Specialisation | means a sequence of Courses in a study area at the postgraduate level. Specialisations usually constitute 4 courses or 24 units at the postgraduate level, but this may vary depending on the Program; |
| Study Period | means the time over which a course is run, for example a trimester, a semester, or an intensive; and |
| Study Plan | means a schedule for an individual student that lists a recommended sequence for undertaking all Courses within their Program. |
